

LA JOLLA PARKS AND BEACHES, INC.  
MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING, MONDAY, JANUARY 26, 2015  
La Jolla Recreation Center: 618 Prospect St, La Jolla 92037

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1. Quorum was established. Dan Allen welcomed all and the meeting was called to order at 4 PM.

2. **The agenda** was approved, motion by Ester Viti, seconded by Rebecca Morales, passed by unanimous voice vote.
3. Dan Allen introduced **new member Bob Evans** who replaces John Beaver, who resigned.
4. Dan Daneri introduced **Ranger Parish Rye**, who is newly added second City park ranger serving in La Jolla and La Jolla Shores; he spoke about his experience and anticipated duties.
5. **Public Comment:**
  - John Leek, San Diego Council of Divers, noted the re-opening of South Casa beach and the appearance of a sea lion there.
6. **Annual Election of Officers:** There being no nominations from the floor, it was moved to accept the candidates reported last month by the nominating committee; motion by Ester Viti, seconded by Phyllis Minick, passed by unanimous voice vote. Dan Allen is re-elected president and Mary Ellen Morgan is re-elected Secretary, each for a two year term, and Bill Robbins is elected as vice president to fill the remaining one year term of John Beaver. (Sally Miller continues in her second year term.)
7. **New Business: La Jolla Half Marathon**, Scripps Park, Sunday, April 26<sup>th</sup> - La Jolla Kiwanis and In Motion Events. Plans were presented by Leisha Battles, Christine Adams, and Don Hodges. The apparent usage of the park is 80%; moved by Patrick Ahern and seconded by Ester Viti to approve, passed by unanimous voice vote.
8. **Old Business:** Ann Dynes gave a presentation on our **Whale View Point Shoreline Enhancement project**. After discussion three motions were passed:
  - a. Priority should be given to studies of storm water drainage and of historicity at **Climbing Wall** to support restoration of the wall and reconstruction of the eroded walkway, recognizing that some coastal access would be lost, although those identified in the Community Plan and LCP will remain; motion by Ester Viti, seconded by Rebecca Morales, passed by unanimous voice vote.
  - b. Considering initial and maintenance costs and restrictive City rules, the **sidewalk/walkway** should be redone in concrete rather than the decomposed granite called-for in the Master Plan; motion by Ester Viti, seconded by Rebecca Morales, passed by unanimous voice vote.

- c. Clarifying the motion on vegetation maintenance and replacement in the **Salt Bush area**, the plant type replacement and supplement should be as advised by the landscape contractor; motion by Jane Reldan, seconded by Ester Viti, passed by unanimous voice vote.
9. **Minutes**, meetings of 27 October and 8 December; motion to approve by Ester Viti, seconded by Phyllis Minick, passed by unanimous voice vote.
  10. **Treasurer's Report** for month of December; motion to accept by Ester Viti, seconded by Stan Minick, passed by unanimous voice vote.
  11. **Old Business, continued - La Jolla Cove Pavilion**: Judy Halter and architects Taal Safdie and Scott Maas presented the schematic design with changes made since last month. Members and guests had further comments and several suggested revisions. Motion to approve the schematic design as presented with further minor changes as agreeable to the Pavilion committee; moved by Judy Halter, seconded by Ester Viti, passed by unanimous voice vote.

Some discussion followed on the next phase of the project, which would be “bridging documents”, which document the design and establish the scope of work for a Request for Proposal from a “design-build contractor”, and in our case includes processing of the Coastal Development Permit. No action was taken.

12. **President's Report:**
  - President Allen reported for LJP&B at the La Jolla Town Council “State of La Jolla” event.
  - Former member Justin Schlaefli will continue to manage the website, and he invites comments: [justinspearo@gmail.com](mailto:justinspearo@gmail.com)
  - La Jolla Kiwanis is donating \$900 to our operating fund.
13. **Committee Reports:**
  - Phyllis Minick reported for the **Children's Pool Walkway Beautification** project that there was no news yet on anticipated completion of the permit phase.
  - The Coastal Access committee, Melinda Merryweather, is monitoring the **Princess Street access** litigation outcome (Kretowicz).
14. **New Business, continued:**
  - a. The president proposed a **LJP&B budget** for 2015. Basis of the budget is a \$900 donation from Kiwanis. It assumes liability insurance will be paid from general funds and not the WVP project; motion to accept by Ester Viti, seconded by Rebecca Morales, passed by unanimous voice vote. *The budget is shown on the next page.*

There was some discussion of economizing and using the proceeds for purchase of a PowerPoint presentation projector and screen. No action was taken.
  - b. An update of our priorities for **City of San Diego capital budget** for FY2016 was reviewed. Motion to accept by Ester Viti, seconded by Patrick Ahern, passed by unanimous voice vote. *The CIP priority list is shown on the page after next.*
  - c. Possible recommendations for **City of San Diego operating budget** for FY2016 were put off to the next meeting.
